INSTALLATION OF BULB FOR TEDDY NightLight™

- ◆ USE only a 10, 13 or 15 Watt Compact Fluorescent bulb.
- ◆ DO NOT USE A REGULAR INCANDESCENT OR HALOGEN BULB. THEY WILL OVERHEAT.

High efficiency, compact fluorescent bulbs can be found at all major hardware, home improvement and lighting stores. They come in a variety of shapes; coil and tubular, and a range of wattages.

We recommend a 10, 13, or 15 Watt bulb. The 10 or 13 Watt is the equivalent of a 40 Watt incandescent bulb and a 15 Watt is the equivalent of a 60 Watt incandescent bulb. We strongly recommend **NOT** using a bulb greater than 15 Watts.



1. Remove the plug from the wall socket.
2. Remove the plate located at the bottom of the lamp.
3. Insert the bulb directly into the lamp socket and twist the bulb into place.
4. Reattach the plate to the bottom of the lamp.

- ◆ USE only a 7 Watt Night Light Bulb
- ◆ DO NOT USE A HIGHER WATTAGE BULB. IT WILL OVERHEAT.

This 7 Watt Night Light Bulb can be found at all major hardware, home improvement and lighting stores. We strongly recommend using a 7 Watt bulb.

1. Remove the plug from the wall socket.
2. Remove lamp socket located at the bottom of the lamp by squeezing the 2 levers.
3. Take out lamp socket and install bulb.
4. After installation, push lamp socket back, making sure it sits firmly in the hole.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS FOR

TeddyLight™ AND TEDDY NightLight™

1. Plug the cord into the wall socket. This plug will fit in a polarized outlet only one way.
2. Turn the Teddy's hat until the white plastic shade lines up with the "window" in the outer shade. There is an "on"/"off" switch located on the cord.
3. Rotate the dial until it clicks. It will take a moment or two for the bulb to light up. **NOTE:** It is natural for bulbs of this type to flicker several times before lighting.
4. To adjust the amount of light coming from your lamp, twist the lid to the left or right. To completely darken the lamp, twist the lid 180 degrees so that the hole is facing the back of the lamp.

Congratulations! You are the owner of the revolutionary KosherLamp. Soon you will be bringing more light to your Shabbat and Yom Tov. Before operating your lamp, please read the following safety, installation, operation and *halachic* (Jewish Law) instructions.

IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

CAUTION

- ◆ DO NOT operate near flammable gas or liquids.
- ◆ DO NOT immerse in water.
- ◆ TO reduce risk of electric shock or fire, remove plug from the wall socket when changing the bulb.
- ◆ USE only a 10, 13 or 15 Watt Compact Fluorescent bulb.
- ◆ Do not use if the compact fluorescent bulb is broken. It is a fire hazard.
- ◆ In the event your lamp falls, please ensure that the bulb is intact before using.
- ◆ For environmental reasons, please dispose used bulbs as you would used batteries.
- ◆ DO NOT USE A REGULAR INCANDESCENT OR HALOGEN BULB. THEY WILL OVERHEAT.

This product has a polarized plug (one blade is wider than the other) as a safety feature. This plug will fit in a polarized outlet only one way. If the plug does not fit fully in the outlet, reverse the plug. If it still does not fit, contact a qualified electrician. Never use an extension cord unless the plug can be fully inserted. DO NOT attempt to defeat this safety feature.

The small amount of heat generated by the bulb escapes through the patent-pending baffle system in the lid of the lamp. There is a vent hole in the front of the lid which allows heat to escape, but not the light. **Please ensure this hole is not covered.**

HALACHA

TWISTING THE SHADE OF YOUR KOSHERLAMP™

All authorities would permit twisting the inner shade on Shabbos. It is similar to opening or closing a closet door in which there is a light burning on Shabbos. This is even the case where the shade forms part of the lamp. R. Neuwirth writes explicitly in Shemiras Shabbos:

A shade which is made to direct the light or to cover it up altogether may be adjusted on Shabbath, even if it is made in such a way that it forms part of the lamp.

Shemirath Shabbath Kehilchathah 13:41b

MOVING KOSHERLAMP™ ON SHABBOS

While twisting the upper shade to control the light is permitted by all authorities, many poskim hold that the lamp itself (outer shade and base) is considered muktza, in the same way that a candlestick would be considered muktzah. However a candle may not be moved at all while it is lit because this may cause the flame to burn brighter or go out. With the electric lamp there is no question about the bulb burning brighter or going out, so it may be moved, although this must be done with a shinui, for those who hold the base is muktza. Therefore if you need its place or need to move it to change the direction of the light, this must be done with a shinui (not the regular way) such as pushing it with one's elbow.

The **KOSHERLAMP™** is made to accept only a compact fluorescent bulb. Since there is no filament, there is nothing that is burning. So some authorities do not consider it to be a lamp, but rather an electric appliance which may be moved as long as the plug is not inadvertently removed from the wall socket. In any event, consult your local orthodox Rabbi for a ruling about moving the lamp on Shabbat.

MOVING KOSHERLAMP™ ON YOM TOV

A portable electric lamp may be moved on Yom Tov, even while it is on, either for the purpose of using it or because one needs the space which it occupies, provided one is careful not to disconnect it from the electricity supply. (Shemirath Shabbath Kehilchathah 13:40)

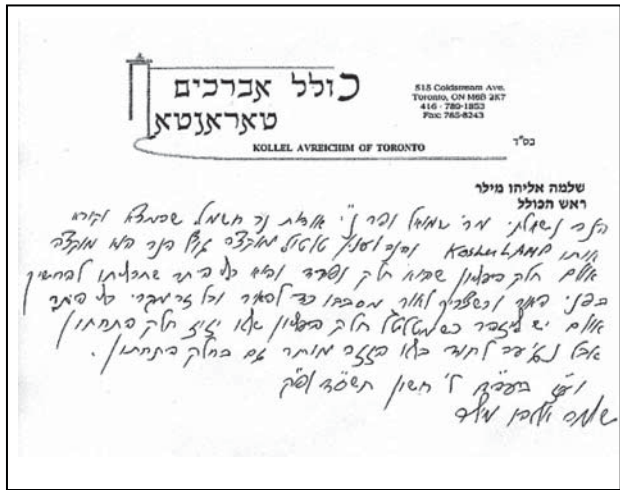

I was asked by Rabbi Shmuel Veffler concerning an electric lamp he invented called "**KOSHERLAMP™**."

With respect to "moving *muktza*," the body of the lamp is *muktza*, however the upper portion of the lamp [the top and inner cylinder] is a separate part and is a "*kli heter*" (permitted vessel) whose purpose is to shade the light. When light is desired, one turns it [the top] to expose the light. All this is called "*kli heter*," (permitted) but one should be careful when turning the top not to move the base of the lamp. However touching or holding the bottom of the lamp without moving it is also permitted.
